10	АОВ	 1: How is TLA pushing achievement for Y4 and Y9 to improve attitude to learning and outcomes? TLA is dedicated to removing barriers to enable students to achieve their potential. TLA has a dedicated Pastoral and Mental Health Team working with identified students in areas from family financial barriers, safeguarding and attendance. Some students have a phased return to learning by accessing the Student Learning Curve area where they follow a bespoke accelerated learning program. Across Primary and Secondary TLA has Personal Development program for all students to get them Life Ready and Work Ready. 2: Last academic year there were a small number of students who did not gain places at college. What are TLA doing to support this year's Y11 students? Students at risk of not being in Education or Employment on leaving Y11 have been identified. TLA are working around these students to identify suitable Post 16 placements. 3: What EAL support is offered at TLA? TLA has around 252 students across school who have English as an additional Language and the numbers are growing. There are over 50+ language spoken as first home language that is not English. TLA has employed Miss Tokitsu as our EAL Champion. Miss Tokitsu oversees the program for our new to English students so 	

		that they gain confidence to read, hear and speak English in the classroom. Students are allocated a device (usually small laptop) to help with translations. Dictionaries are ordered that can be used in GCSE exams.
